#### **Principal's Report**

#### **School Lunches**

From Monday 4th September, we ask that students no longer bring food that requires heating up, either in the microwave or with boiling water. There is a safety risk with students having access to boiling water for two-minute noodles and the microwave is not in the classroom building so we cannot leave them unattended to heat up food. Students are welcome to toast their sandwiches with adult supervision from a member of staff. If your children prefer warm food, it is a great idea to invest in a good quality thermos. By preparing it before school, it should stay warm until lunchtime.
