Welcome to Term 3, it has certainly been a wet and cold start! Lake Mountain Ski Day—Thursday 1st August

All students will be travelling to Lake Mountain for a day of ski lessons, the toboggan run and snow play. Unfortunately we were unsuccessful with our Sporting Schools grant application for Term 3. The grant usually enables us to offer the excursion for free, however **this year the cost to families will be \$50 per student**. This includes park entry, a 1.5 hour ski lesson, hire of poles, skis and boots, access to the toboggan run and a snow play package. The school will cover the cost of bus transport. If you have Camps, Schools and Excursions Funding (CSEF), you will be eligible to use that money to pay for the excursion. Please keep an eye out for the permission form on uEducateUs and approve it as soon as possible. I will also be sending you a note asking you to advise us if your child has their own snow jacket, pants, waterproof gloves and beanie. We have a collection of snow clothing at school and next week we will be fitting students who need to borrow gear.

2024 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grants Program



Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant

We are thrilled to announce that Buxton Primary School has received a 2024 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant for our project, Balam Balam (butterfly) Garden.

The aim of our project is to create a butterfly / pollinator garden so that all students in our school can participate in growing flowering plants and habitat that benefit butterflies and other pollinating insects. The students will participate in an investigation identifying and researching local butterflies and pollinators including researching the best flowering and habitat plants that could be used in our Balam Balam Garden design. Through our Taungurung language and culture program with Aunty Lee, students will research selected native plants, say the names of plants and understand how these are represented in writing. The expected outcomes of the project include students learning about identifying and proving plants, the importance of looking after the environment to provide balam balam with pollinating and habitat plants. By relating our Taungurung language and culture program closely to the butterfly garden students will be able to link the Taungurung creation story 'The Birth of the Balam Balam'. Students can make connection of caring for others from the story by looking after pollinators especially butterflies and how they look after us and the environment. The design and development of our Balam Balam Garden with the local indigenous Taungurung culture will only enrich our students' hands-on learning journey.

Buxton Primary School is one of 1,041 primary schools and early learning centres across Australia to receive a Woolworths Junior Landcare grant to help grow our next generation of environmental champions.

The children and teachers are looking forward to getting their hands dirty and learning from this project – we'll keep you updated!
