Principal's Report

Big Emotions and Repairing Relationships

One of the most important responsibilities we have in schools is to support children to recognise and name their emotions, learn strategies to calm and regulate when overwhelmed, and repair relationships after conflict. Emotional regulation is challenging for all of us, but particularly so for our neurodiverse students and family members.

We place so much pressure on ourselves to be a "good" parent or educator, but what does that really mean? There is so much advice (too much really) about the way to do this. I definitely don't have the answers, but there are the key principles I try to follow in my roles of teacher, principal and parent to support kids to thrive. I thought it would be helpful for you to hear the messages they get from adults at school.

- Clear, consistent expectations and boundaries help kids feel safe
- When I mess up, lose my temper or make a mistake, I apologise and work to repair the relationship
- Help kids learn to recognise and name their emotions and identify their triggers (we all have different triggers)
- Provide opportunities for kids to be off devices and bored! Their creativity and patience depend on it
- Listen to them, even when you feel that you can't listen to one more story about their favourite game or show
- Tomorrow is a new day, with a fresh start and a chance to improve on today

I'm sharing this in solidarity, to say that we know that parenting is exhausting, frustrating and wonderful at the same time. Schools sometimes seem like places of judgement for parents, but that is never our goal. None of us have the answers and we are all doing our best. We are a team!

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

Buxton Primary School is now proud to be a SWPBS School.

What is School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)?

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a framework that helps schools to plan and implement practices across the whole school to improve educational and behavioural outcomes for all students.

Rationale

Introducing, modelling and reinforcing positive social behaviour is an important step in a student's educational experience. SWPBS works on the belief that we cannot assume that students know how to behave. Students need to be explicitly taught the behaviours we want them to demonstrate. Behaviours need to be taught, modelled, practised and rewarded.

Aims and Objectives

The primary aim of SWPBS is to improve educational outcomes for students. It achieves this through:

the prevention of behaviour problems and management of existing issues positively and consistently

developing skills and knowledge in schools for better teaching and learning

creating and maintaining a better school environment for students, teachers and the whole school community

increasing student engagement, with the ultimate outcome being improved academic outcomes for all students
